3724. Banduri II, 570, 572; some letters of the exergue may be reversed. For other specimens including imitations see Lafaurie 1987, 308 n. 18; one may suspect that very tiny Victory and Cross imitations such as those found at Ouerre (Eure-et-Loire) are also derived from Valentinian III rather than from Justin or

Justinian, whatever may be the date of production (Lafaurie 1966). It is probably this series rather than the gold prototypes that inspired 13th century imitations at Strasbourg and Seltz; see Nessel 1908, 1909.
