387. For a possible later issue for Pulcheria see Cayon 1985, 2921 no. 13, though this may be no more than a reproduction of a tremissis in silver; the mint-mark is incomplete.

389. This issue was probably struck down to the end of the reign, since it is often overstruck by Marcian (no. 528) with the same type. Late coins may have obverse reading **AVG** (DO. 398) or **AVG** (DO. 397); L has a clear example

of the early **A**.

390. *P* (MS note to p. 73 no. 109, cited from Mayreder) and Laffranchi 1931, 8 report a similar coin for Licinia Eudoxia; unconfirmed, and might be of Eudoxia I (see Arcadius no. 50. *RSC* Eudocia no. 11).

391. *Gn*, Arg. 2. The star on this piece has six points only: ✱.
