48, 49. Wreath-ties 1 and 2; some with smaller busts are probably pre-395.

49. Banduri (II, 543) also cites with mint-mark **ANTA**; misread.

50. Seaby, December 1960; see Ulrich-Bansa 1935, 25. There is no evidence for a variety with ✱ in the wreath (Goodacre 1928, 28 no. 7; Cayon 1985, 2852 no. 11). A silver piece is reported by Banduri (II, 562–3) with obverse Fh4 but reverse **GLORIA** –

ROMANORVM (*sic*), Constantinopolis enthroned facing, mint-mark **ALE**, perhaps the same piece as *D'Ennery* 2234, with normal **Æ** type, mint-mark **ANTZ** (*sic*). These must be false, but it is possible that the genuine **Æ** type exists also with mint-mark **CONS***; see Theodosius II no. 390.
