ARIADNE

Aelia Ariadne was the eldest daughter of the Emperor Leo I and Verina, and was born prior to her father's elevation to the purple. In 467 she was married to Zeno and the union resulted in the birth of a son, Leo II, who was proclaimed Augustus in 473, briefly reigning with his father after Leo I's death in 474. She fled with Zeno to Isauria when Basiliscus revolted and took possession of the capital, remaining with him there for twenty months before returning to Constantinople in October 476. When Zeno died in 491 Ariadne selected his successor, Anastasius, and married the new emperor to legitimize his position. She died in 515, toward the end of Anastasius' reign.

No silver coins were minted in her name.
